

# The Carney Family

## 8.1 Origins

- 8.1.1 Although documentary evidence has not yet been found to establish the exact place of origin, it can be firmly stated that the family is of Irish descent, and most probably from County Down. When and why they came to the Isle of Man has not yet been determined, but the period of the Irish potato famines, the mid-1840s, is the most likely date. The name is recorded variously as Karney, Kearney and Carney. The modern spelling on the Isle of Man of Carney is known from about the middle 18th century.

The Oxford Dictionary of Surnames states that the name is Irish, being an anglicised form of O Catharnaigh, warlike. The name appears in the book "Personal Names of the Isle of Man", by J.J. Kneen, where it is derived from O'Cearnaigh, a descendant of Cearnach, "the victorious one".

## 8.2 CORNELIUS KARNEY—1800

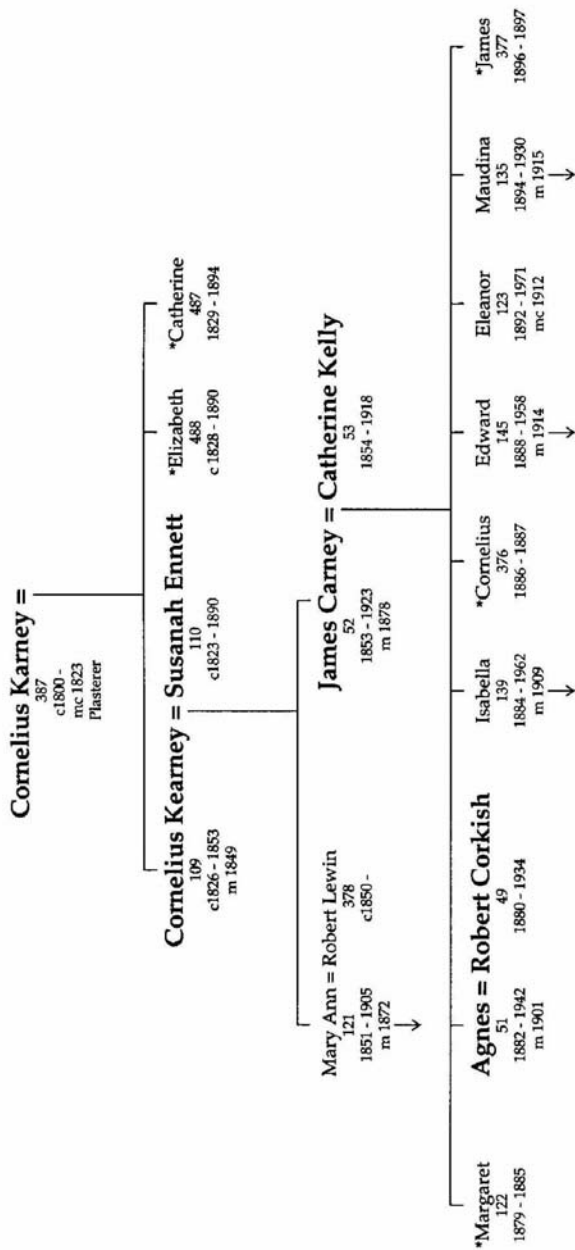
- 8.2.1 Cornelius Karney (387) would have been born in approximately 1800, at County Down, Ireland. The name of his wife has not yet been determined. On the marriage certificate of his son, his profession is stated as "Plasterer". There appears to have been at least three children of the marriage.

- 8.3.1 Cornelius Kearney (109) would have been born in approximately 1825/6, in County Down. He married Susanah Ennett on the 30th of December, 1849 at Kirk

Braddan (see 9.3.1 for her family details). In the marriage register Cornelius is described as being of full age. His name is recorded as Karney, his occupation is given as labourer and he is a bachelor of Lord Street, Douglas, the son of Cornelius Karney (430), a plasterer. Witnesses to the marriage were John Maquire, William Craig and James Corran. Sometime after his marriage, Cornelius and Susanah moved to Liverpool where their daughter was born in February 1851. The family appears to have returned to Isle of Man by 1853 where Cornelius died on the 1 of September, 1853 aged twenty-seven. See 8.4 for details of his descendants.

If the age given at his death is correct, he would have been born in the last quarter of 1825 or the before the 1 of September 1826 which would mean that he was actually twentythree or four when he married.

Cornelius (109) is buried at Kirk Braddan in Section 1, Block 3, Grave 1900. The memorial inscription mentions his two sisters, Catherine and Eliza, and a Rose Maguire see 8.3.4 below.

8.3.2 Eliza Kearney (488) was born in 1827/8 in County Down, Ireland. She died, a spinster, on the 23rd of February, 1890 at the House of Industry, Douglas, when her age is given as sixty-two years and her place of birth as County Down.

8.3.3 Catherine Kearney (487) was born in approximately 1829, in County Down. In the 1881 census she is recorded as an unmarried, Boarding House Keeper, aged fifty-two and born in Ireland. She died at 11, Osborne Grove, Douglas, in 1894 a spinster aged sixty-five years. Present at her death was Ellen O'Hare of County Down, Ireland. Catherine is buried with her brother and sister at Kirk Braddan.

8.3.4 Rose Kearney (489) was born in approximately 1838, in Ardglass, County Down. She married John Maguire (490) a shopkeeper of Senna road. She died in 1900 aged sixty-two years and is buried with Cornelius and his sisters at Kirk Braddan. Present at her death was a Catherine Smith of County Down (related to Ellan O'Hare). The exact relationship between Rose and the Karney family has not yet been established, but, as she is buried with the family, it seems likely that there was a fairly close relationship, though possibly only by marriage. It is noted that a John Maquire was a witness at the marriage of Cornelius and Susanah.

In 1881 she was living with her husband at 15, Fredrick Street, aged 45. His occupation is recorded as "grocer & seafarer". In 1891 she was keeping a sweet shop at 15, Frederick Street, Douglas, aged 63.

8.4.1 Mary Ann Carney (121) was born on the 23rd of February, 1851 at 1 Court, Wigan Street, Liverpool. On the birth certificate, her mother is listed as "Mary Carney, formerly Innett". The variation Innett is of no consequence but the christian name, Mary, may be of further interest. In 1861 she was living with her mother and step-father at 8, Hanover Street. In 1871 she was living with her mother and her step-father at 33, Barrack Street, Douglas. She was employed in the potato factory. She married Robert Lewin on the 4th of July, 1872 at Kirk Braddan (see Volume II, 16.16.2). In 1881 she and her family were living at 4, Bigwell Street. Lodging with the family was Susan Muftin, a 59 years old widow. this was

presumably her mother. In 1891 she and her family were living at 17, Bigwell Street. She died on the 7th of June 1905. There were eight children of this marriage, but only four survived to adulthood, see Volume II, 16.17 for details of her descendants.

- 8.4.2 James Carney (52) was born on the 26th of December, 1853 in Douglas. He married Catherine Kelly (see 11.8.2) on the 20th of October, 1878 at Kirk Braddan, when the witnesses were John Kivell and Robert Lewin, his brother-in-law. He died on 13th of January, 1923 aged sixty-nine years. See 8.5 for details of his descendants.

In 1861 he was living with his mother and step-father at 8, Hanover, Street. In 1871 he was living with his mother and step-father at 33, Barrack Street and described as a mariner. Full details of his seagoing life have not been determined, but he is known to have been away from home for extended periods. He is believed to have suffered a stroke at which time he gave up foreign sailing and served as First Mate on the Liverpool-Douglas sailings. It is assumed that at this time he was employed by the Isle of Man Steam Packet Company, but neither this, nor the identity of his earlier employers, has been confirmed.

In 1891 he and his family were living at 6, Lord Street, Douglas, when he was employed as a seaman. In 1901 he and his family were living at 4, St. Barnabas Square and he was employed as a ship's porter. He was described as "Labourer" at the marriage of his daughter Eleanor, in October 1912.

- 8.5.1 Margaret Elizabeth Carney (122) was born on the 20th of August, 1879 at 11 Drinkwater Street, Douglas. She died just two months before her sixth birthday on the 17th of June, 1885 at 60, Smithfield Street, Liverpool. The death certificate lists her father as "James Carney, Mariner". Her mother, Catherine, reported the death and made her mark.

- 8.5.2 Agnes Carney (51) was born on the 2nd of May, 1882 at 11, Upper Milk Street, Liverpool. Her father is recorded as James Carney, mariner, and her mother as Catherine Carney, formerly Kelly.

In 1891 she was living with parents at 6, Lord Street, and attending school. At the census of 1901 she was working for Margaret Corlett at 7, Mount Havelock. She married Robert Henry Corkish (49) on the 7th of September, 1901 at St. George's Church, Douglas. Her age is given as 19 and her address is given as 16, Nelson Street, Douglas. Her father's occupation is again given as Mariner. The witnesses at the marriage were John Henry Cromwell and Isabella Carney. Robert Corkish's address is given as 2, Athol Square, Douglas and his occupation as Mason. Robert emigrated to Pugwash, Nova Scotia, Canada, prior to the First World War. Agnes and the family were delayed in joining him until after the War, during which

Robert served in France with the Canadian Army. From his service record we learn that Agnes was living at various time during the War at 12, Nelson Street, 4, St. George's Street and 31, Big Well Street. Agnes moved to Pugwash, N.S., with all her children, except for her eldest daughter Catherine who had married in the summer of 1918, in the summer of 1919 after Robert had been demobilised in Halifax. After the death of Robert in 1934, Agnes moved to Ontario with her youngest son, Daniel (62) and his three youngest sisters. The family lived for a while with the eldest son, James (60). In 1936 Agnes returned to the Isle of Man with her unmarried children, Daniel, Mary, Jean and Peggy. Agnes died at 10, Princess Street, Douglas, on the 20th of April, 1942 with her eldest daughter, Catherine, in attendance. She was buried at Braddan on the 23rd of April. See Volume IV, 6.11.5 for details of her descendants.

8.5.3 Isabella Carney (139) was born on the 30th of June, 1884 at 13, Upper Milk Street, Liverpool. In 1891 she was living with her parents at 6, Lord Street, Douglas and attending school. In 1901 she was living with her parents at 4, St. Barnabas Square. She married Thomas Johnson (140) on the 1 of May, 1909, from 16, Nelson Street, Douglas. The witnesses were Robert H. Quayle and Harriet Emily Callin. She followed her husband to Saskatoon in the summer of 1912 with their three sons, the youngest of whom, George (144), was only six months old at the time. Her sister Maud accompanied her to help care for the children. Her daughter, Irene, recalls that Isabella operated a bakery for a time in Imperial, Saskatchewan. This would be sometime between 1922 and 1926. It appears that the owner, Mr. McEwan had died and that Bella did the baking while her friend, Mrs. McEwan, looked after the shop. Isabella died on the 2nd of November, 1962, aged seventy-eight years. See 8.6 for details of her descendants.

8.5.3.1 Thomas Johnson (140) was born on the 7th of May, 1884 at Foxdale. At the time of his marriage to Isabella he is described as a bachelor and joiner of East Foxdale. His father was Ed Johnson, a farmer. He emigrated to Saskatoon in approximately 1911, accompanied by his brother-in-law Thomas Oates (husband of Thomas's sister). For a while he worked as a carpenter before going into business for himself. Soon after his arrival, he worked with an elderly motor engineer, mainly on the repair of farm tractors. He learned the art of chromium plating, which adversely affected his health. He took over the business when the elder partner retired. He died on the 19th of April, 1957. See 8.6 for details of his descendants.

8.5.4 Cornelius Carney (376) was born on the 20th of November, 1886 at 6, Lord Street, Douglas. He died on the 7th of January, 1887, aged seven weeks.

8.5.5 Edward Carney (145) was born on the 7th of December, 1888 at Nelson Street, Douglas. He married Christine Eleanor Shimmin on the 1st of November, 1914 at St. Barnabas Church, Douglas, see Volume IV, 23.12.2. This Church, together with many of the streets associated with the Carney family, was demolished in a large development of the late 1920s. Edward died on the 15th of January, 1958 aged sixty-nine years. See 8.10 for details of his descendants.

In 1891 he was living with his parents at 6, Lord Street. In 1901 he was living with his parents at 4, St. Barnabas Square. Trained as a rope maker and became a foreman rope-maker at Quiggan & Co. Ltd., who made ropes for the IoM Steam Packet Co. and shipped their products world-wide (rope making has now ceased). Edward was a keen gardener. He played Rugby football and was a committee member of the St. George's Association Football Club.

8.5.6 Eleanor (Uttie) Carney (123) was born on the 17th of January, 1892 at 12, Nelson Street, Douglas. In 1901 she was living with her parents at 4, St. Barnabas Square. She married Thomas Cannell (124), on the 1 of October, 1912, at St. Barnabas when she is described as '21, a spinster of 12, Nelson Street, daughter of James Carney,

Labourer'. Thomas is described as '23, a bachelor of 1, King Street, son of Henry Cannel, Coastguard deceased'. The witnesses were John Cain and Agnes Cannell. Thomas died on the 15th of January, 1958. Eleanor died on the 2nd of May, 1971. See 8.11 for details of her descendants.

- 8.5.7 Maudina Carney (135) was born on the 2nd of June, 1894, at Fleetwood House, North Quay, Douglas. Her registration of birth records her name as Catherine, which has caused a great deal of confusion. For some time during the research of this family history, it was assumed that Maud or Maudie (as she was known throughout her life) and Catherine were two distinct people. However, it is now accepted that Maud was recorded as Catherine at the registration of her birth. The most likely explanation is that there was a mix up between the registrar and the mother, Catherine (53), who was illiterate and probably would not have realized that the wrong name had been recorded. The following is a summary of the current evidence.

Birth	The name is recorded on a birth registration for the 2nd of June, 1894, but is otherwise unknown in the family. No registration of death for an infant or child has been found.

Baptism	A baptism for Maudina Kearney has been found at St. Matthew on the 8th of August, 1894. This would be consistent with a birth at the beginning of June. The parents are recorded as James and Catherine Kearney.
Name	Maud and Maudie are natural contractions of Maudina.
School	Entry number 485 in the Register of the Hanover St. School, Douglas, records a Maud Carney born on the 2nd of June, 1894

The above information would seem to provide conclusive proof that Catherine and Maud were the same person.

Maud emigrated to Canada in the summer of 1912 with her sister Isabella, taking the place of an elder sister who had a change of mind. She settled in Saskatoon. She married Arthur Duncan (136) on the 22nd of February, 1915, at Langham, Saskatchewan. The witnesses were H.E. Mason and E. Hartshorne, both of Lanham. Her daughter recalls that Maud, together with a friend, were involved in a wedding catering business. Maud died on the 14th of May, 1930 in, it is believed, an automobile accident. There were two children of this marriage.

- 8.5.7.1 Arthur Duncan (136) came from the Midlands (possibly the Willenhall area), where the family name is also recorded as Duncombe. Arthur's birth or baptism may have been recorded under Duncombe. This has not been researched. His children were advised to change their names to Duncombe before obtaining passports (it is not clear whether this advice was tended in the U.K. or in Canada). His daughter states that he was born on 17th March, 1882, and that he was eleven years older than her mother. The record of his marriage at Langham gives his ages as twentysix, i.e. he would have been born in 1894/5 and would have been five years older than Maudina. At his marriage his occupation is given as 'baker' though he is known to have later worked at Richard Road Machinery. Arthur is known to have returned to the U.K. in approximately 1936. He died on the 5th of February, 1966.

- 8.5.7.2 Frederick Charles Duncan (137) was born on the 18th August, 1915. He is known to have moved to the U.K. in 1938. He married Alice Parsons (540) on the 5th of April, 1947, at the church of St. Anne, Willenhall. There were two children of the

marriage. Jane Duncan (551) born on the 14th of November, 1950 and Philip Duncan (552) born on the 22nd of June, 1954. He died on the 19th of April, 1982.

- 8.5.7.3 Maud Duncan (138) was born on the 29th of February, 1920. Maud moved to the U.K. in early 1937, in her words "I came by liner for the coronation". She married William Bert Rathbone (550) on the 22nd of July, 1939. There were three children of the marriage. Marilyn Hilda Rathbone (554), born on the 9th of July, 1944, William Arthur Rathbone (553), born on the 19th of December, 1939, and Brian Francis Rathbone (555), born on the 12th of March, 1947.
- 8.5.8 James Wilfred Carney (377) was born on 12th of July, 1896 at 4, Big Well Street, Douglas. He died on the 13th of July, 1897 aged one year.

- 8.6.1 Thomas Edward Johnson (385) was born on the 17th of October, 1909, at East Foxdale, Patrick. Emigrated to Canada in 1912 and grew up in Saskatoon. Worked as a mechanic for Greyhound Bus Lines before joining his father in the family business. He married Eleanor Snustead on the 3rd of October, 1948. There were three children of the marriage. Ted died on the 6th of October, 1972. See 8.7 for details of his descendants.
- 8.6.1.1 Alice Eleanor Snustead (503) was born on the 17th of November, 1928. She married Ted Johnson (385) on the 33rd of October, 1948. After Ted's death, she remarried to Benjamin Delbert Chrispen (518) (born the 9th of April, 1929) on the 26th of June, 1982. See 8.7 for details of her descendants.
- 8.6.2 James William Johnson (143) was born on the 2nd of January, 1911, in Douglas. He moved to Saskatoon with his family in 1912. He was employed as a foreman with Richardson Machinery. He married Norene Erickson (519) (born 27th of August, 19??) on the 1 September, 1953. He died on the 28th of August, 1959. There were no issue of the marriage.
- 8.6.3 George Wilfred Johnson (144) was born on the 7th of February, 1912, in Douglas. When just six months old he moved with his family to Saskatoon. He worked as a carpenter with Sterling Millwork before joining his father in the family business. He served overseas with the Canadian Army during World War II. He married Mary Elizabeth Mulcock (520), born on the 6th of April, 1920, on the 26th of December, 1942. He died on the 19th of November, 1987. See 8.8 for details of his descendants.
- 8.6.4 Hilda May Johnson (141) was the first of the children to be born in Canada on the 6th of June, 1915 in Saskatoon. She married Francis Harold Lewis (521) (born 7th of September, 1905) on the 5th of October, 1946. The couple moved to South Porcupine, Ontario, where Frank died in March 1971. Hilda then returned to Saskatoon. There was no issue of the marriage.
- 8.6.5 Harold Robert Johnson (386) was born on the 1 of January, 1917, at Saskatoon.

- 8.6.6 Edna Irene Johnson (142) was born on the 29th of June, 1927 in Saskatoon. As a child visited, with her family, the Isle of Man on two occasions. Irene worked as a stenographer with the Federal Department of Agriculture for thirteen years. She married John Hurly (522) on the 3rd of August, 1957. There are three children of the marriage.
- 8.6.6.1 John Hurley (522) was born on the 10th of January, 1928, of english extraction. He farms at Lockwood, Saskatchewan.

- 8.7.1 Eleanor Dianne Johnson (504) was born on the 10th of March, 1949. She married John Patrick Dolan (507) (born 20th of October, 1947) on the 6th of June, 1970. They have two children: Tracy Erin Dolan (508) born on the 10th of July, 1976 and Cindy Dianne Dolan (509) born on the 25th of September, 1978.
- 8.7.2 Roderick Edward Johnson (505) was born on the 4th of July, 1953. He married Debra Joanne Brown (510) (born 25th of August, 1954) on the 9th of November, 1974. They have two children: Jenifer Leigh Johnson (511) born on the 13th of December, 1976 and Mark Thomas Edward Johnson (512) born on the 6th of January, 1982.

8.10.3.1 John (Jack) Zavitz (394) was born on the 9th of August, 1919 at Weland, Ontario, the son of Harvey Tobias Zavitz and Ann Maxwell. He was a ledger keeper for the Bank of Nova Scotia when he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on the 11th of November, 1940, at which time his citizenship was stated to be British. After pilot training he was appointed Pilot Officer on the 1 of May, 1942. He was posted to the Royal Airforce at Perth in November, 1942. In June of 1944 he was posted to 420

Squadron, by which time he had been promoted to Flight Lieutenant. His aircraft was destroyed on a mission to Hamburg on the night of 28–29 July 1944. Jack and all his crew were killed. He is buried at the British Cemetery, Soltau, Becklingen, Germany in Plot 19, Row B, grave number 14.

8.11.1 Catherine Harriet Cannell (125) was born on the 9th of June, 1913. She married Thomas Kelly (126). There were two children of this marriage. Harriet died in December 1988 or 1989

8.11.1.2 Sheila Kelly (128), the second daughter, is known to have married John Humphreys (407) and to have two sons.

8.11.2 James Cannell (129) was born in approximately 1915. He married Edith Morrison (130) in approximately 1935, probably in Douglas, Isle of Man. The two children of the marriage, Thelma (131) and James (132), are remembered as being older and younger than myself, i.e. as being born in 1936 and 1939.

8.11.3 Thomas Henry Cannell (133) was born in approximately 1919. He died, unmarried and without issue, on the 7th of March, 1962 aged forty-three years.

8.11.4 Vera Cannell (134) was born in approximately 1921. She died, unmarried and without issue, on the 3rd of May, 1941 aged twenty years.
